

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION
in the event "Legnickie Pole 1241"

§1. General information

1. "Legnickie Pole 1241" is a public, free of charge Event that focuses on history, sports and recreation. It aims to provide active recreation and commemorate the "Battle of Legnica" of 9 April 1241.
2. The Event will be held between June 5th and June 6th 2026, according to the programme available to the public.
3. "Legnickie Pole 1241" is an Event that involves reenactment. Participants and Historical Exhibitors are required to have costumes, equipment and other artifacts that resemble the historical reconstruction of the 13th century.
4. Each person who wishes to attend the Event as a participant is required to register via an online form prepared for this purpose by the Organiser.
5. Each participant is obliged to undergo verification of the historical accuracy of the costume in which they plan to attend the Event.
6. Children under the age of 16 are allowed to wear contemporary shoes of natural colours, provided that they resemble historical ones.
7. Persons approved by the Organiser may attend the Event as a Participant.
8. The Event is open to the public, free of charge and voluntary.
9. The Exhibitors, Artists and Contractors participate in the Event under separate arrangements, applications and contracts. However, this does not exempt them from the obligation to become acquainted and comply with the Terms and Conditions.
10. The provisions of the present Terms and Conditions shall apply without exception to all persons participating in the Event.
11. The present Terms and Conditions determine the rules of participation and safety that apply during the Event.

§2. Relevant definitions and phrases

1. *Terms and Conditions* – the present document, which determines the rules of participation and safety during the Event.
2. *Event* – a festivity under the name of "Legnickie Pole 1241", which is held from June 5th to June 6th 2026 in the village of Legnickie Pole, in the green areas along Księżnej Anny Street.
3. *ID badge* – a marker that distinguishes Participants staying at the camp, who reenact living in the 13th century, from other people at the event.
4. *Organiser* – the entity responsible for the organisation of the Event, *i.e.* the Communal Office in Legnickie Pole and the Communal Sports and Recreation Centre in Legnickie Pole together with their delegated staff.
5. *Participants* – people with an ID badge who stay at the Camp during the days of the Event. They primarily include historical reenactors and Volunteers: extras and security.
6. *Leader* – a person who is the representative and head of the reenactment group (Participants), who is also responsible for it during the Event.
7. *Guests* – persons who participate in the Event as spectators, tourists, who are not involved in the organisation and do not belong to a group of either: Participants, Exhibitors, Artists, Organisers, Volunteers or Emergency Services.
8. *Exhibitors* – persons selling their medieval-themed products at the Historical Bazaar and persons selling contemporary products on the shopping street, previously registered with the Organiser.
9. *Contractors* – persons holding positions and operating stalls on the premises of the Event, with whom the Organiser has made separate arrangements.
10. *Artists* – bands, persons performing on the Stage who have individually signed contracts with the Organiser specifying the terms of cooperation.
11. *Security Volunteers* – persons wearing plastic badges marked "Volunteer", who assist the Organisers during the Event and ensure order and security.
12. *Emergency Services* – they include Firefighters of the VFD units, personnel of the Police, Private Security Company (hired by the Organiser), Community Health Centre, Emergency Medical Service and Security Volunteers.
13. *Camp Leader* – the person who organises the Camp and is responsible for maintaining order in the Camp area.
14. *Reenactment* – otherwise known as the *Battle*, a spectacle featuring reenactment groups and spectators which includes **SIMULATED COMBAT SCENES** aiming to recreate the Battle of Legnica of 9 April 1241.
15. *Camp* – the site at Księżnej Anny Street in Legnickie Pole where Participants are to pitch historical tents and form one large encampment.
16. *Historical Bazaar* – the site at Księżnej Anny Street in Legnickie Pole where historical stalls will be located, in which Exhibitors can sell their own products.
17. *Shopping Street* – Benedyktynów and Księżnej Anny streets in Legnickie Pole, where contemporary stalls will be located, in which Exhibitors can sell their products.
18. *Stage* – a designated place in the green area near Księżnej Anny Street.
19. *Battlefield* – the place of the Reenactment, the green area near Księżnej Anny Street where the Reenactment will be held.

§3. General provisions

1. An information tent will be located at the entrance to the Event's area, where it will be possible to obtain any necessary information about the Event.
2. Guests, Participants, Exhibitors, Contractors and Artists are obliged to comply with the instructions of Emergency Services and the Organisers.
3. Emergency Services and the Organiser are authorized to search individuals within the Event's area to determine whether they are in possession of any dangerous objects that may threaten safety.
4. It is prohibited to satisfy physiological needs within the Event's area and the precincts, except in places specially designated for that purpose.
5. Destroying, vandalizing or damaging facilities and equipment within the Event area is prohibited.
6. All persons participating in the Event are required to maintain the Event area in a sanitary condition. All waste must be deposited in designated waste bins.
7. All persons participating in the Event are required to behave in accordance with social norms, which include no excessive use of alcohol and no disruption of public order.
8. Any disputes, conflicts or other misunderstandings should be immediately reported to the Organiser.
9. All attending the Event are strictly forbidden to use any intoxicants or to carry exposed weapons (the latter does not apply to Participants within the Camp area during rehearsals and during the Reenactment).
10. Smoking is prohibited in conspicuous places in the Event area and is strictly prohibited in the place of the Reenactment.
11. Children may only be present in the Event area under the direct supervision of their parents or guardians.
12. All animals in the Event area must be under the constant supervision of their owners and kept on a leash. The owner is responsible for any damage caused by the animal. In addition, the owner is obliged to remove excrement left by the animal in areas frequented by those attending the Event.

§4. Responsibility of the Organiser

1. The Organiser, with the assistance of the Emergency Services, is responsible for the safety of all persons participating in the Event, as well as for organising rescue operations.
2. The Organiser is not responsible for any belongings of those attending the Event that are left unsupervised.
3. The Organiser is not responsible for any actions that are not in accordance with the present Terms and Conditions.
4. Each Participant participates in the Reenactment under their own responsibility.

§5. Vehicle Parking and Temporary Traffic Management

1. For the duration of the Event, a temporary traffic management scheme shall be implemented within the village of Legnickie Pole and on the access roads leading to the Event site, in accordance with the approved traffic management plan.
2. The temporary traffic management measures referred to in Section 1 shall be in effect during the following periods:
 - from June 5th 2026, between 3:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m.;
 - on June 6th 2026, between 12:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.
3. Within designated areas established by the Organizer, the following measures may be introduced:
 - a complete prohibition on vehicle traffic;
 - restriction of access to authorized vehicles only, including, in particular, emergency services, security services, the Organizer, and exhibitors;
 - changes to traffic direction or other traffic arrangements required for the proper conduct of the Event.
4. Event Participants shall comply with all temporary traffic management measures, road signs, and instructions issued by security personnel, information staff, and authorized traffic controllers.
5. Vehicle parking is permitted only in areas designated by the Organizer or in accordance with applicable traffic signs and regulations.
6. Parking of vehicles is prohibited:
 - on access roads, fire lanes, and emergency evacuation routes;
 - in any manner that obstructs pedestrian or vehicular traffic;
 - in areas reserved for emergency, security, or technical services.
7. To the extent permitted by applicable law, the Organizer shall not be liable for vehicles or any property left therein.
8. Vehicles parked in violation of applicable regulations or in a manner that interferes with the organization of the Event may be removed at the owner's expense in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

§6 . Regulations for Commercial and Exhibition Areas

1. The Organizer may establish designated commercial and exhibition areas within the Event premises, including, in particular:
 - the Historical Market;
 - the Commercial Street;
 - other sales and promotional areas.

2. Commercial and exhibition activities may be conducted only in locations designated by the Organizer and subject to the Organizer's prior approval.
3. Entities conducting commercial or exhibition activities shall be required to:
 - comply with these Regulations;
 - maintain order and cleanliness within the area in which such activities are conducted;
 - comply with instructions issued by the Organizer, as well as by security and information personnel;
 - conduct their activities in accordance with applicable laws and regulations, particularly those relating to the sale of goods, food safety, and consumer protection.
4. Within the Historical Market, only the sale and presentation of goods consistent with the nature and theme of the Event shall be permitted, in particular goods related to historical reenactment and traditional crafts.
5. Within the Commercial Street, the sale of general merchandise shall be permitted, provided that the products offered do not violate applicable laws, regulations, or accepted standards of public decency.
6. The Organizer reserves the right to refuse admission to, or remove from the Event, any entity conducting commercial or exhibition activities that violates these Regulations or acts in a manner inconsistent with the nature and purpose of the Event.
7. To the extent permitted by applicable law, the Organizer shall not be liable for any property belonging to entities conducting commercial or exhibition activities.

§7. Tournaments and competitions

1. During the Event there will be tournaments and competitions, dedicated to the Participants, *i.e.*:
 - a. Horse Archery Tournament (June 5th 2026);
 - b. Combat Tournament (June 6th 2026);
 - c. Traditional Archery Tournament (June 6th 2026).
2. Tournaments and competitions are entered by registration, as specified for each in separate terms and conditions.
3. The tournaments and competitions are open to anyone who meets the conditions specified in their respective terms and conditions.
4. The Organizer reserves the possibility of additional competitions, which will be announced on an ongoing basis.

§8. Artists

1. Artists shall participate in the Event under separate terms and conditions, in accordance with the agreements concluded with the Organizer prior to the Event.

§9. Camp Participants

1. Registration of Camp Participants will be held from June 4th to June 6th 2026, 10.00 a.m., with the Camp Leader.
2. The Medieval Camp shall be open and in operation from June 4th 2026 through June 7th 2026.
3. An ID badge will be issued for the Participants.
4. Each Participant is obliged to carry the ID badge with them.
5. Persons shall register individually with the Camp Leader upon arrival.
6. A leader who registers a group is responsible for all its members throughout the Event.
7. At the time of registration, each person will be given an ID badge as well as the Terms and Conditions for their viewing, which they are required to become acquainted with.
8. Each Camp Participant is required to sign the list, thereby confirming their attendance and familiarity with the present Terms and Conditions.
9. The leader shall be a party in all matters concerning contact between the Organizer and the group.
10. The Organisers provide the area to set up the Camp (a grassy area near Księżnej Anny Street), fuel, hay for the horses, as well as access to toilets and water within the Event area. Sanitary facilities are available at the gymnasium located at 7 K. D. Asama Street, upon prior arrangement with the Organizer.
11. The Organizer provides food for the Camp Participants (June 5th – one meal in the form of a late dinner, June 6th – breakfast, dinner, banquet, June 7th – breakfast).
12. Participants are obliged to maintain the image of the entire Camp, preserving the medieval atmosphere of the 13th century.
13. Each Participant is obliged to wear clothes/costumes modelled on the 13th century and to use historical utensils.
14. It is strictly forbidden to wear only historical underwear on the Camp's premises.
15. Participants are obliged to conform to historical realities both at the Camp and in the Reenactment area.
16. Participants are obliged to clean the area surrounding their own encampment on a regular basis.
17. Contemporary objects are not allowed on display outside the tents.
18. Participants are required to use cameras and mobile phones discreetly.
19. The Camp Leader has the authority to give instructions regarding camp life to all Participants and enforce them.
20. Participants are strictly prohibited from consuming alcohol on the day of the Reenactment (*i.e.* June 6th 2026), until its conclusion.
21. The Organizer and the Camp Leader reserve the right to inspect the state of sobriety of the Participants.
22. Participants must keep their own weapons and armament in a way that does not endanger the health and lives of others.

23. Participants should be well acquainted with the rules of **SIMULATED COMBAT** and safety of historical reenactment, with particular regard to the Battle, which each group's Leader is responsible for ensuring.
24. All combat scenes and simulated clashes should be performed in accordance with safety rules, with special care so as not to endanger the life and health of persons and animals present.
25. The East and West Leaders are responsible for the weapons inspection before the rehearsal on June 6th 2026 and before the Reenactment.
26. If a Participant experiences any contraindications or health problems, they are obliged to report this fact to the Camp Leader, the Organiser or Emergency Services before the Reenactment commences.
27. Participants are obliged to comply with the programme of the Event as well as the script of the Reenactment, and to behave in accordance with social norms, which include no excessive use of alcohol and no disruption of public order or quiet hours.
28. After the Reenactment, the Participants are required to gather in order to march in formation before the spectators. Before entering the Reenactment area, the Leader is obliged to once again examine the condition of the Participants' weapons. If the Leader finds a weapon that poses a threat or danger to the fellow Participants, they may, without explanation, confiscate it until the conclusion of the Event.
29. During the Reenactment, each Participant should wear a costume imitating the reconstruction of the 13th century, but they are simultaneously obliged to ensure that it poses no danger to themselves or other Participants.
30. It is advised that each group assigns some members to stand watch over the Camp area for the duration of the Reenactment.
31. Participants participate in the Reenactment voluntarily and under their own responsibility.

§10. Security Volunteers

1. Volunteers, having registered on the days of the Event, *i.e.* 5th – 6th of June 2026, shall perform the tasks specified at prior meetings and the briefing on the day they report to the person designated by the Organiser.

§11. Reenactment (Battle)

1. The Reenactment shall be held on the grassy area near Księżnej Anny Street in an open space, secured with fencing in the form of nets and barriers to prevent unauthorised access of third parties to the Battlefield.
2. The entrance to the secured area is located near the junction of Księżnej Anny and Benedyktynów streets.
3. Standing places for the spectators, prepared by the Organiser, are marked with barriers on the green areas along Księżnej Anny Street.
4. Considering the extent of the simulated combat and safety during the Reenactment, the Emergency Services may decide to redirect some people outside of the marked area.

§12. Image sharing

1. During the Event, photographs and video recordings documenting the course of the Event will be taken.
2. The materials referred to in Section 1 may be used by the Organizer for informational, documentary, and promotional purposes related to the Organizer's activities and the promotion of the Event.
3. As the Event constitutes a mass public event, participants acknowledge that their image may be recorded as part of the overall scene, including, in particular, as part of a crowd, landscape, public gathering, or large-scale public event, without the need to obtain separate consent.
4. Where an individual's image is captured in an identifiable and individual manner (in particular through prominent depiction of a person, portrait photographs, or interviews), the publication or dissemination of such image shall require the prior consent of the person concerned.
5. Any person who does not consent to the publication of their image in circumstances exceeding those described in Section 3 should notify the Organizer before participating in the Event or immediately upon becoming aware that such material has been recorded.
6. Detailed information regarding the processing of personal data, including image data, is set out in the Privacy Notice available from the Organizer and on the Organizer's website.

§13. Final provisions

1. All persons participating in the Event are required to be acquainted with the Terms and Conditions.
2. These Regulations are available on the Organizer's website and at the information point throughout the duration of the Event.
3. Any person violating the provisions of these Regulations may be required to leave the Event premises. Where necessary, the Organizer may request the intervention of the competent authorities or emergency services.
4. In matters not regulated by these Regulations, decisions shall be made by the Organizer in accordance with the applicable laws and regulations.
5. Decisions made by the Organiser are definitive.
